On behalf of the thousands of needy victims Nachas currently represents and serves, I would like to express my appreciation for your consideration of the grant proposal submitted. I am responding to the inquiry for clarification requested by Special Master Judah Gribetz. The total number of Nazi victims expected to be served in the first year of the program, without overlap, would be four thousand survivors. The total program cost for the first year would be \$2,249,500.00. The average per person cost for this period would be \$562.38.
