**MEMORANDUM & ORDER**

KORMAN, Chief Judge:


On March 31, 1999, pursuant to Rules 23 and 53 of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure, I appointed Judah Gribetz as Special Master to prepare a proposed plan of allocation and distribution of the settlement proceeds. Following my adoption of the Distribution Plan on November 22, 2000, on December 8, 2000 I “extend[ed] Judah Gribetz’s appointment as Special Master so that he may continue to assist the Court in its monitoring and supervision of the [implementing] agencies’ activities on behalf of the Looted Assets, the two Slave Labor and Refugee Classes” (the “December 8, 2000 Order”). At my direction, Special Master Gribetz also has assisted the Court, with Special Masters Paul A. Volcker and Michael Bradfield, in implementing and supervising the Deposited Assets Class claims resolution process.

Special Master Gribetz has been assisted since his March, 1999 appointment by Shari C. Reig, an attorney in his law office. In recognition of her responsibilities, I hereby amend the

December 8, 2000 Order to appoint Shari C. Reig as Deputy Special Master. In that capacity, she will continue to assist the Court and Special Master Gribetz in overseeing the implementation of the Distribution Plan among the five settlement classes. Except as modified herein, all other provisions of the December 8, 2000 Order shall remain in full force and effect.
