- 1) The personal information on the beneficiaries is strictly confidential and only available in the Fund Secretariat. The Fund Auditor's reports will not contain such information.
- 2) General information on the payments made to a group of beneficiaries or in a country can be published.
- 3) The Fund does not publish information on the amount and date of payments made by an organisation, unless that information is already public or unless the organisation authorised the Fund to provide this information to third persons. Please be in touch with the Fund Secretariat in order to find out which information from an organisation's distributions can be published.
- 4) The general conclusions contained in the Fund Auditor's reports are considered as information which could be quoted, we however ask you to contact the Fund Secretariat if you plan to include such information your Report.

We highly appreciate the great care which you and your staff are putting into the preparation of the Report to Judge Korman. As agreed during our telephone conversation, we are at your disposal for any information you may need. Status

- The Fund has already decided on the allocation of about 288 million CHE. The whole
 initial Fund means of a total of 223 million CHE and almost all of the interests of 20
 millions CHE are attributed.
- Of the 288 million CHF, that have already been allocated, about 267 million CHF were transferred to partner organisations to arrange the payments to the beneficiaries.
- 205 million:CHF of these 267 million CHF are already paid to the beneficiaries
- Needy Jews in Eastern Europe received about 65 million CHF, Jews in the USA about 44 million CHF. Jews in Israel receive about 86 Million CHF.
- About 43 million CHF were allocated to non-dewish-persons
- After the decisions are taken on the pending applications which amount to over 3,3 million CHE, the entire Fund means will have been attributed.
